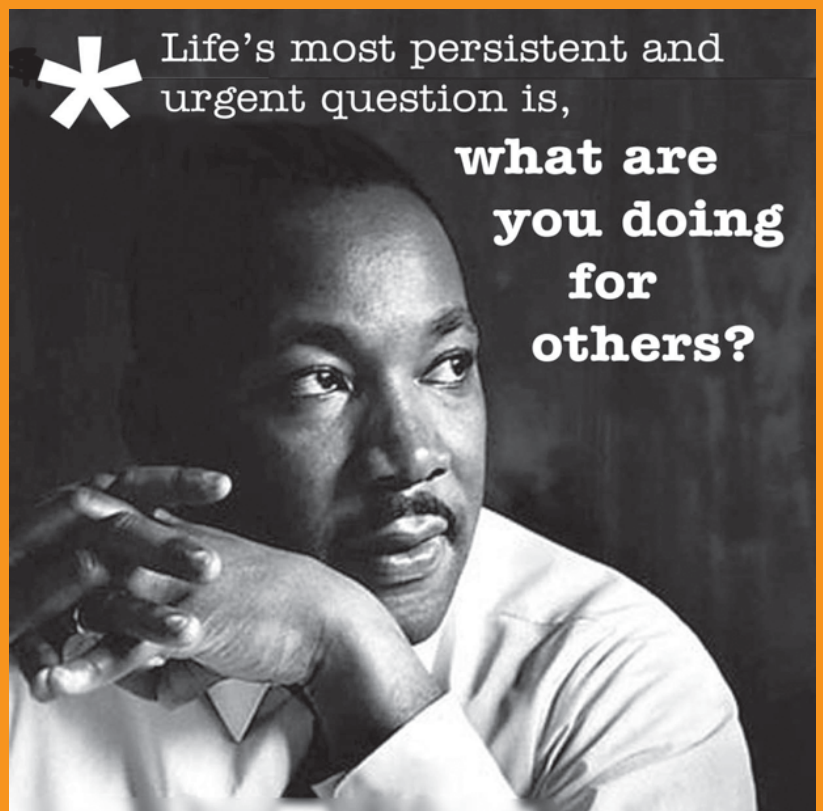


MLK Day of Service
