SUMMARY OF ADMINISTRATIVE EXPERIENCE

Chief executive officer of Pitzer, a college which has produced more student Fulbright Fellowships over the past eight years than any other undergraduate institution and is the youngest liberal arts college to be ranked in the top 40 of *U.S. News & World Report*. Overall responsibility for the College's 1,000 students, 71 faculty and 211 staff with an operating budget of \$50 million and an endowment of \$113 million. Currently serving second term as chair of the President's Council of the Claremont Colleges, the cooperative governance body of the Claremont University Consortium, which includes five undergraduate college and two graduate university presidents.

Significant accomplishments to date include: (1) orchestrating financial stability: annual balanced budget, two completed fundraising campaigns both surpassing goals ahead of schedule (total raised \$60 million), endowment increased by 151 percent, Annual Fund totals increased by 59 percent; (2) overseeing environmentally sustainable campus master planning: additional campus acres acquired (426 percent increase) with 90 percent dedicated to environmental programming, eight LEED-certified buildings completed (total budget \$70 million), 50 percent decrease in campus water usage attained; (3) building reputation and awareness: 40 percent increase in *U.S. News & World Report* ranking (#70 to #42), 61 percent decrease in admit rate; (4) expanding/enhancing the academic program: 13 percent new faculty positions, 20 percent increase in students studying abroad to 77 percent of student body (vs. 2 percent nationally), 58 new domestic and international exchange programs developed, initiation of Vaccine Development Institute in partnership with the University of Botswana, development of Firestone Center for Restorative Ecology in Costa Rica, and founding of The Conservancy for Southern California Sustainability at Pitzer College.

Significant accomplishments included: (1) building reputation and awareness nationally by advancing the institution from the fourth to the second tier in *U.S. News & World Report*; (2) expanding and improving the academic program by creating a mandatory four-year co-curricular program (The Coe Plan) of real life applications for a liberal arts education and providing leadership to internationalize the curriculum; (3) increasing student retention by 10 percent; (4) reorganizing the long-range planning process by institutionalizing an assessment process that reviewed each academic program and established a standing assessment committee; (5) providing leadership for establishing a technology-driven liberal arts environment on campus including development of a web-based interdisciplinary statistics program involving the departments of biology, mathematics, sociology and economics.
