Application Process

- Common Application
- \$70 Application Fee
- Pitzer Writing Supplement
- Optional 250-Word Writing Supplement
- School Report
- Official High School Transcript
- One letter of recommendation (from teachers in humanities, social sciences, foreign language, mathematics, or natural sciences)
- TOEFL or IELTS required from applicants whose native language is not English
- International Scholars Program (ISP)

Outstanding international students who demonstrate proficiency in English (70-100 TOEFL; 7 or below IELTS) are eligible for joint admission to Pitzer College and the International Scholars Program. ISP provides ongoing support as students move into increasingly demanding courses across the college curriculum.

Test-Free Policy

Beginning with the admission cycle for fall 2022, Pitzer College switched to a test-free admission policy, which will remain in place for at least three years. This change comes nearly two decades after becoming the first college on the West Coast to adopt an SAT-optional admission policy. Pitzer College uses a holistic approach to student admission with emphasis placed on high school transcripts, recommendation letters, leadership positions, work history, involvement in school and community activities, and commitment to Pitzer's core values. The College will not accept or review SAT or ACT scores as a part of the admission process.

 For the Class of 2027, the overall acceptance rate was 16.7%.
