LAX is located approximately 50 miles west of Claremont.


> Taxi or ride sharing service fares are approximately \$80 from LAX to Pitzer.

## Campus Parking


- > The Admission Office is located on the first floor of Pitzer Hall. Convenient parking is located in the adjoining East Mesa Parking Lot.

## **Orientation Overview**

During Orientation, you will:

- > meet Pitzer faculty, staff, and students for discussions and academic advising;
- > register for classes;
- > settle into your new residence hall;
- > participate in social and recreational activities;
- > and make friends across The Claremont Colleges!

The Office of Parent Relations plans an informative day of orientation sessions especially for your parents/ guardians the day you move in to your residence hall.

## **Orientation Adventures**

Orientation Adventures—the off-campus components of Pitzer's new student orientation program—begin the day after you move in.

### What Happens?

You will spend four days on excursions with 10 to 15 of your peers in, above and around the greater Southern California area developing meaningful relationships with your fellow new students from day one.

#### **Selecting Your Orientation Adventure**

Descriptions of the 2024 Orientation Adventure options will be released in early summer. Soon after, you'll receive a form to submit your preferences.

## Academic Advising

In July or early August, you'll find out which Pitzer faculty member will be serving as your academic advisor.

You will meet with your faculty advisor during New Student Orientation to create a study program that meets your needs and fulfills Pitzer's Educational Objectives.

## Class Registration & First-Year Seminar

Registration for your first semester courses—which will include your first-year seminar—happens during New Student Orientation with the help of your academic advisor.

#### **Selecting a First-Year Seminar**

First-year seminars provide you with an introduction to college-level discussion, reading and writing-and are led by Pitzer faculty.

- > Information about first-year seminars will be sent to your Pitzer email address in June.
- > During the summer, you'll receive a form to submit your five preferred first-year seminar selections.

## Placement Exams

Pitzer offers placement exams during New Student Orientation to ensure you are registering for appropriate level courses.

#### Math

Students planning to register for math courses must take a math placement exam.

#### Chemistry

Students planning to register for chemistry courses must take a chemistry placement exam.

#### Language

The following exams will be offered for students considering language courses:

- > Arabic > Italian > Portuguese > Chinese
  - > Japanese > Russian
- > French > Korean > Latin > Spanish > German

#### When & Where

All dates, times and locations of placement exams will be published in the New Student Orientation schedule.

## Housing & Dining

Most first-year students are assigned to Atherton, North Sanborn, East Sanborn, and Pitzer Halls (PAS Halls). First-year rooms in PAS are double occupancy (two beds in each room) connected to another double occupancy room by a shared bathroom (four people per bathroom).

#### **PAS Resources**

- > Study Rooms. Multiple study rooms are located throughout the complex providing private, quiet study space where individuals or groups can work on classwork. Two study rooms provide access to a printer and computer available to the community.
- > Living Rooms. Three living rooms serve as social gathering places with items such as comfortable seating, a TV, a piano and a DVD player.
- > Community Kitchen. The kitchen has a refrigerator, oven, stovetop, dishwasher, sink and a small dining area. Students are encouraged to bring their own cookware.
- > Laundry Rooms. Laundry rooms are located in every residence hall.
- > Residence Life Office (C300). Located in the corner between North Sanborn and East Sanborn Halls, students will find toilet paper, a vacuum cleaner and cleaning supplies in this office. Questions about housing, the Room Draw process, Residence Life leadership positions, and more can be addressed here as well.

## Meal Plans

All students living in the residence halls are required to commit to a meal plan. Students wishing to change their plan may do so during the first week of classes each semester. No changes are permitted after this time.

#### **Meal Plan Options**

- > 19 meals in a one week period including \$190 flex dollars per semester
- > 16 meals in a one week period including \$160 flex dollars per semester
- > 14 meals in a one week period including \$140 flex dollars per semester
- > 12 meals in a one week period including \$120 flex dollars per semester

Flex dollars are included with the meal plan and can be used for additional meals at any of the Claremont Colleges dining halls and wide array of eateries including Grove House, Pit Stop and Shakedown. Additional flex dollars cannot be purchased.

#### **Claremont Cash**

- > Claremont Cash is credit applied to a student's ID card that can be used for laundry, vending machines, extra dining hall meals and both food and non-food items throughout the Claremont Colleges.
- > It can also be used at select merchants in the Claremont Village

## Health & Safety

COVID-19 vaccinations and an initial booster dose are required for all Pitzer students unless an exemption for medical or religious reasons has been approved. If you plan to request a medical exemption, please email Student Health Services; for religious exemptions, please contact the Office of Admission at **admission@** pitzer.edu by June 1, 2024. Early Decision students requesting exemptions will need to contact Pitzer prior to their enrollment deadline.

- > Students Currently Residing in the United States: As a reminder, Pitzer College requires all students currently residing in the United States to be fully vaccinated upon arrival this fall or to have received an exemption via the process above. The college may not be able to provide COVID-19 vaccinations upon arrival to domestic students.
- > Students Arriving from International **Destinations and International Students:** A detailed email will be sent to all students coming from international destinations regarding Pitzer's vaccination requirement; this will include guidance from the World Health Organization, early arrival processes, and support for students needing to self-quarantine and set up vaccination appointments upon arrival in Claremont. ## PAYING FOR PITZER

PITZER USES A WEB-BASED APPLICATION, CASHNET, TO MANAGE STUDENT ACCOUNT BILLING. STUDENTS WILL BE ABLE TO ACCESS THEIR ACCOUNT INFORMATION BY LOGGING INTO THE PITZER STUDENT PORTAL.

## Billing & Payment

We realize parents are often responsible for making the payments and need access to the same student account information. CASHNet has the ability for students to authorize multiple users to access monthly statements and even make online ACH payments. Students can create a personalized login for parents and guardians if they are assisting with covering the costs of a Pitzer education.

#### **Billing Date Details**

- > Fall semester charges are applied to the student account in mid-July in advance of billing on the first business day of August.
- > Spring semester charges are applied to the student account in mid-December in advance of the billing on the first business day of January.
- > Once monthly statements are published, emails are sent to the student and any authorized user(s) informing them that the statement is available. If the statement remains unviewed, a reminder email will be sent a week later.
- > Statements are generated if there is a balance, credit balance or any account activity during the
- > Delinquent accounts are subject to a monthly late payment fee of \$50 if payments are not made by the 20th of the month.

#### **Receiving Financial Aid?**

Your aid package (excluding work-study) will be factored when calculating any amount due to the College. For statements to be accurate, it is important to submit all required information to the Office of Financial Aid.

## **Payment Options**

The Pitzer College Payment Plan offers convenient monthly payment options to those who do not wish to make full payment at the beginning of the semester.

#### **Standard 8 Pay Plan**

- > Fall and spring semester charges are divided into four monthly payments.
- > Payments are due the 20th of the month, August – November and January – April.

#### **Standard 8 Pay Plan with Pre-payment Option**

> Opt to make a pre-payment—payment before official billing—during the months of July and December resulting in reduced payments over the remaining four months of each semester as noted above.

#### **Payment Plan Details**

> To participate, complete the Payment Plan Agreement form and return to the Student Accounts Office by June 30. You can find the form in the student-accounts section of the Pitzer website:

- > Pitzer College charges an enrollment fee of \$50 each semester for participating in the payment plan option.
- > Late enrollments will be accepted until July 31, but will be assessed a late fee in addition to the payment plan fee.

## Student Accounts

The Student Accounts Office is responsible for the billing and collection of tuition, fees and incidental charges. This office:

- > processes payments, credits, refunds and incidental charges;3
- > generates monthly statements; and
- > assists students and their families in understanding aspects of their student account.

Student Accounts will send important information regarding billing, due dates and payment plan options during the first week of June to all students who have committed to attending Pitzer.

\* Incidental charges and credits originate from departments across the College and the Claremont University Consortium—such as parking citations, library fines, student health services charges and student housing fines.



All students are required to have medical insurance that comprehensively covers them while enrolled at Pitzer.

- > If a student does not have medical insurance that meets waiver requirements, they will be enrolled in the College's medical insurance plan and billed accordingly.
- > The Office of Student Affairs will provide additional information during the summer, along with final costs. www.pitzer.edu/student-accounts/health-insurance

## Financial Aid

The Office of Financial is responsible for reviewing student aid eligibility and helping families navigate the financial aid process.

> Students who applied for aid and submitted all documents by the deadlines are automatically considered for need-based aid. Students who applied for aid should reference their aid letter for additional details.

#### **Loan Options**

Students and parents interested in borrowing through the following loan programs should contact the Office of Financial Aid for additional details.

- > Students: U.S. Citizens and eligible non-citizens may be eligible to borrow up to \$5,500 a year from the Federal Direct Loan program. The program offers both subsidized and unsubsidized loan options at low interest rates. Interest rates are subject to change each year but have ranged from 2.75% to 5.05% in the past five years.
- > Parents: The Federal Direct Parent PLUS Loan allows parents of dependent students who pass a credit check to borrow up to the full cost of attendance. The interest rate for this loan is subject to change each year, but has ranged from 5.35% to 7.5% in the past five years.
