

Why should I get vaccinated?

- COVID-19 vaccination will help protect you by creating an antibody (immune system) response without having to experience sickness
- None of the COVID-19 vaccines can make you sick with COVID-19

Vaccine Types

There are currently 3 COVID-19 vaccines, you should get whichever is available to you first!

- Johnson & Johnson
 - Single dose, fully effective after two weeks
- Pfizer
 - Two doses about 3 weeks apart, fully effective two weeks after the 2nd dose
- Moderna
 - Two doses one month apart, fully effective two weeks after the 2nd dose

Vaccine Myths

- COVID-19 vaccinations **do not** increase the risk of infertility
- COVID-19 vaccines **do not** alter your DNA
- You should still get vaccinated **even if** you have tested positive for COVID-19 before
- COVID-19 vaccines **do not** contain a microchip

What does it mean to be vaccinated?

COVID-19 vaccines are effective at preventing COVID-19 disease, especially severe illness and death. However, we're still learning how well COVID-19 vaccines keep people from spreading the disease so you can still test positive and spread the virus after receiving the vaccine.

After being fully vaccinated you should still take precautions like wearing a mask, staying 6 feet apart from others, and avoiding crowds and poorly ventilated spaces. Follow these guidelines whenever you are...

- In public
- Gathering with unvaccinated people from more than one other household
- Visiting with an unvaccinated person who is at increased risk of severe illness or death from COVID-19 or who lives with a person at increased risk








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
