- <u>Cal Poly Pomona Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Program</u>: The College of Business Administration's Accounting Department prepares individual income tax returns through the IRS VITA program
- <u>City of Claremont, Senior Program</u>: Volunteers assist seniors in filling out their income tax forms
- IRS Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) and Tax Counseling for the <u>Elderly (TCE) Programs:</u> Free basic tax return preparation to qualified individuals
- IRS Free File: IRS Free File lets you prepare and file your federal income tax online using guided tax preparation, at an IRS partner site or Free File Fillable Forms. It's safe, easy and no cost to you for a federal return.

# **CLEARANCE**

Clearance is required usually for students working any protected populations such as: minors, elderly, people with disabilities, people who are incarcerated. If you are not working with these populations your students will not need clearance. Typical clearance requirements include:

- 1. LiveScan (fingerprinting background check)
- 2. Proof of a negative TB test result
- 3. Proof of covid vaccination (some partners only)

# **TB Requirements**

If you are required to take a TB test by your partner organization, please follow these instructions:

- Go to Student Health Services (SHS) and request a TB test.
- 2. Provide proof of negative TB to partner, professor, and CEC.
- 3. Upload your Negative TB Test results which will be shared with your partner upon request **Upload TB Test Result Here**

# LiveScan/Fingerprinting

If you are required to be cleared by your partner organization, please follow these instructions. If for any reason you are unable to complete a LiveScan clearance, please contact cec staff@pitzer.edu immediately:

- 1. Complete a **LiveScan Form**: LiveScan Request Form (if your partner requires you to use their form that's fine)
- 2. Students are required to fill out their personal information:
  - First name, Last name, and Middle name (if applicable)
  - Citizenship information
  - Social Security Number
  - Residence Information
  - Failure to complete all the information required may result in delays in clearance.
- 3. Once this form is complete students will take this form, along with their stateissued ID or passport to Campus Safety or anywhere that offers LiveScan services.
- 4. Your results will be delivered to the agency indicated on your form (Campus Safety or your partner organization).
  - If your results went to Campus Safety, the CEC will be able to send a list to your faculty member.
  - If your results went to your community partner, you will need to follow up with your partner to make sure you have been cleared.

# **Higher Education**

'Trauma and Social Anxiety Are Growing Mental-Health Concerns for College Students'

"Trauma and social anxiety are both increasing among college students seeking on-campus mental-health treatment, according to a new report from the Center for Collegiate Mental Health at Pennsylvania State

University.

The report, released Wednesday, also examined the connection between mental health and academic success, finding that students with certain mental-health risk factors were more likely than their peers to drop out of college. Students' mental health improved more when they stayed enrolled, rather than dropping out."

Summer course: 5/22 - 6/30

**Equity Audits in Higher Educ (ORST149 PZ-01)** 

Tricia Morgan

MTWR 3:15 - 4:50 PM

This course will cover a brief overview of the importance of/need for equity in education and how equity audits can be useful tools for making data-driven leadership decisions. This is a praxis course which will require a collaborative team-based student equity audit project and research work outside of class time. Students will understand the purpose of conducting equity audits, will learn essential framework and procedural elements of equity audits, navigate higher education administrative systems and personnel, collect and analyze data, and proscribe suggested interventions to advance equity in higher education.

# **Sociology of Education (SOC083 PZ-01)**

This course will introduce students to the relationship between education and society by reviewing a variety of theoretical perspectives and key empirical studies in the sociology of education. We will explore topics

including tracking, teacher expectations, student-educator relationships, curriculum, and standardized testing. Prerequisite: SOC 01 SOC Majors only

# Social Justice in Education (ORST060 PZ-01)

This course will cover a brief overview of education history in the US, how educational systems and actors function to either inhibit, maintain, or grow systems of oppression, and tools for advancing social justice in education. These tools include power and asset mapping, moving from ally to accomplice, applying ethical paradigms in context, conducting an equity audit, understanding education as liberation, and the role of both policy and community care in education. Students will understand themselves as both actors and acted upon in educational settings through various social justice lenses, and be empowered to enact meaningful change toward equity within educational institutions.
