Rebecca Ustrell (she/her) is a Latinx, Jewish graphic designer and journalist focusing on the art of print, based out of Upland, CA. She is the Founder and Creative Director of Curious Publishing - a 100% artist-run, non-profit publishing company that uplifts the voices of marginalized artists residing throughout Southern California. In addition to her role at Curious Publishing, she teaches self-publishing and zine-making for teens and adults, and holds public speaking engagements which drive community involvement in literary

arts. Her work focuses on archiving Queer, BIPOC, and neurodivergent artist perspectives in relation to their communities.
