EDUCATION IN THE NEWS

What is critical race theory?

Has 5 conceptions bases:

- "1. Race is not biological; it is a sociological construct.
- 2. Racism is a normal, common and systemic mechanism that racial differences and racial inequalities are maintained.
- 3. Race and racism are "materially deterministic," that is to say, race and racism advantage the dominant group and therefore any racial advancement or racial equity measure will only occur if it benefits the dominant group (in the case of the U.S., white Americans).
- 4. Racial identity is a dynamic process that changes depending on the needs or interests of the dominant group. Different racial groups are racialized differently at different moments in time for different reasons.
- 5. Because of these dynamics, racialized and marginalized peoples have unique insight into the nature of oppressive systems, structures and institutions" (<u>Zalaznick</u>)
