How and When Do I Apply for Financial Aid for 2024–25?

All domestic applicants are required to complete both the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the CSS Profile. Undocumented students only need to complete the CSS Profile. International students only need to complete a Pitzer International Financial Aid Application (PIFAA).

Domestic and undocumented applicants must also submit 2023 federal income tax returns, including all schedules, statements, W-2/1099 forms and business tax returns to the College Board's Institutional Documentation Service (IDOC) by the deadlines.
