Anne Bremer '14 is Sustainable Claremont's Program Manager for the Claremont Energy Challenge. A native of the San Francisco Bay Area, she moved to Claremont in 2010 to attend Pitzer College, where she graduated with a B.A. with Honors in Environmental Analysis. After graduation, she served as the City's Sustainability Program Coordinator, where she planned the Annual Earth Day Celebration, assisted in replacing the City's street and facility lighting with highly-efficient LED lighting, and worked with Sustainable Claremont to organize Claremont's participation in the 2015-2016 CoolCalifornia Challenge. In April, Claremont won the Challenge and was awarded over \$50,000, along with the title of "Coolest City in California." In her current role as Sustainable Claremont's Program Manager for the Claremont Energy Challenge, she aims to make Claremont a finalist for the \$5 million Georgetown University Energy Prize.



Marlene Salazar '13 is an Associate at the Leadership for Urban Renewal Network (LURN) where she manages outreach and operations for LURN's economic development programs. Her career thus far includes working on land-use and environmental justice initiatives in South Los Angeles. Marlene is passionate about making sure investment and development in low-income communities is driven by the residents that live in them.
